1. Competition Format:

a. Individual Recurve:

Events (male and female) shall consist of Qualification Round and Elimination Rounds. The competition formats are as follow:

Qualification Round

- a. Two (2) rounds of 36 arrow each
- b. Six (6) ends of six (6) arrows per round
- c. Four (4) minutes per end

Elimination Rounds

- a. 1/32 match-play chart
- b. Maximum five (5) sets of three (3) arrows two (2) points for a win, one
 (1) point for a draw and zero (0) points for a loss
- c. Timing: 2 minutes per set for non-alternative shooting, 20 seconds per arrow for alternate shooting
- d. The first athlete to reach six (6) points wins the contest and qualifies for the next round

All shots in Qualification Round and Elimination Rounds are taken from a distance of 70m with 122cm target face, with a maximum of ten (10) points per arrow. The athlete with the highest score/number of set points is the winner.

a-1. PVC Archery, Yeoman, Bowman, Cub and Cadet:

<u>Final Round</u>

- a. Single round of thirty (30) arrows each
- b. Ten (10) ends of three (3) arrows per round
- c. Two (2) minutes per end
- d. Top three (3) archers of each category boys and girls will be declared medal winners accordingly.

All shots in Final Round are taken from a distance of 12m with 80 cm target face for PVC Archery, 20m with 122 cm target face for Yeoman, 30m 122 cm target face for Bowman, 50m 122 cm target face for Cub, 70m with 122 cm target face for Boys Cadet and 60m with 122 cm target face for Girls Cadet respectively with a maximum of ten (10) points per arrow per category. The athlete with the highest score is declared the medal winners accordingly.

b. Individual Compound





Individual Compound events (male and female) shall consist of Qualification Round and Elimination Rounds. The competition formats are as follows:

Qualification Round

- a. Two (2) rounds of 36 arrows each
- b. Six (6) ends of six (6) arrows per round
- c. Four (4) minutes per end

Elimination Round

- a. 1/32 match-play chart
- b. Cumulative scoring
- c. Five (5) sets of three (3) arrows
- d. Timing: 2 minutes per set for non-alternative shooting, 20 seconds per arrow for alternate shooting

All shots in Qualification Round and Elimination Rounds are taken from a distance of 50m with 80 cm, 6-ring target face, with a maximum of ten (10) points per arrow. The athlete with the highest score is the winner.

c. Team Recurve:

• Male and Female Team Events

- a. Top three (3) athletes per team/club;
- b. Ranking based on total qualification scores;
- c. Maximum four (4) sets of twenty-four (24) arrows two (2) points for a win, one (1) point for a draw and zero (0) points for a loss;
- d. Each set consists of six (6) arrows at two (2) minutes per set and two (2) arrows per athlete for non-alternate and alternate shooting;
- e. The first team to reach five (5) set points wins the contest and qualifies for the next round.

All shots are taken from a distance of 70m with 122cm target face, with a maximum of ten (10) points per arrow. The team with the highest number of set points is the winner.

d. Team Compound:

• Male and Female Team Events

- a. Top three (3) athletes per team/club;
- b. Ranking based on total qualification scores;





- c. Cumulative scoring for twenty-four (24) arrows four (4) ends of six (6) arrows at two (2) minutes per end and two (2) arrows per athlete;
- d. The team with the highest cumulative score wins the contest and qualifies for the next round.

All shots are taken from a distance of 50m with 80cm, 6-ring target face, with a maximum of ten (10) points per arrow. The team with the highest cumulative score is the winner.

e. Official Draw

After the final entries have been received, the Official Draw for target numbers and order of shooting will be held according to WAF Rules. Three (3) or four (4) athletes will be assigned to each target.

2. Tie-Break Procedures

• Qualification Round

Tie-breaks for both individual and Team events will be conducted in the following manner:

- a. Greatest number of 10's (including inner 10's)
- b. Greatest number of X's (inner 10's)

If athletes are still ties after applying the above, a coin toss will decide the ranking.

• Elimination Round

For individual events, a single arrow will be shot for score. If there is still a tie, the arrow shot closest to the centre of the target face will resolve the tie; or successive single arrow nearest-to-the centre shoot-offs, until tie is resolved. In alternate shooting, the athlete that shot first in the match will start the shoot-off.

For Team events, in the event of a tie, the following tie-breaking procedures will take place:

- a. A three (3)-arrow shoot-off for score, a single arrow by each team member;
- b. If score is tied, the team with the arrow closest-to-the-centre will win;
- c. If still tied, the second (or third) arrow closest-to-the-centre will determine the winner.

In alternate shooting, the team that shot first in the match will start the shoot-off.





3. Penalty Rules

There is a set of penalties for infractions, the most common ones are:

- a. Loss of value of highest scoring arrow shot before or after the allocated time.
- b. If a member of a team crosses the 1m line too soon or if a team member removes an arrow from the quiver before standing on the shooting line, the Judge shall raise the yellow card.
- c. This card indicates that the athlete shall have to return behind the 1m line to start over again or be replaced by another athlete with arrows to shoot, who shall start from behind the 1m line. If the team does not obey the yellow card and the athlete shoots his arrow, the team shall lose the highest scoring arrow for that end.

4. Protests and Appeals

A Judge Commission will be appointed to oversee the technical aspects of the competition. The Judge Commission will be responsible for considering any technical complaints or dispute and taking action when necessary. A Judge's decision is final with respect to the value of an arrow in a target. All disputes must be resolved before any arrow has been removed.

With the exception of the value of a judged arrow and the decision of a Judge to raise a yellow card, an athlete can appeal against any unfair issues that were not according to the WAF Rules and that the decision or action was an interpretation or decision of the Judge.

An intention to appeal, when it might affect the progress of an athlete from one (1) stage of the competition to the next, shall be expressed in writing and lodged with the Chairperson of Tournament Judge Commission within five (5) minutes of the end of the relevant round or match, whichever applies.
